### THORNHAM PARVA PARISH MEETING

Minutes of a meeting of **Thornham Parva Parish Meeting** held in the Village Hall, Thornham Magna on Wednesday 11 November 2015 at 7.30pm

## 2. MINUTES OF LAST MEETING

The minutes of the meeting held on 13 May 2015 were circulated and approved. The accounts for 2014/15 were omitted from the papers circulated with the agenda for this meeting and are now attached.

#### 3. MATTERS ARISING

Martin Kay reported that the application by Progress Power to build a gas powered plant and grid connection on Eye Airfield and in Yaxley respectively had been granted permission.

Christine Moore reported that the brown tourist signs for a historic church, to be sited on an existing sign to Thornham Parva on the A140, should be erected this year. The changes to the directional signs travelling from Thornham Magna should be carried out in 2016.

Christine also reported that the £200 earmarked as a contribution to Thornham Magna for the defibrillator was now not required. The defibrillator still belongs to the ambulance organisation, the box housing the defibrillator was paid for from donations from the late Dame Anne Warburton.

# (f) Proposed Precept 2016/17:

The proposed Precept for 2016/17 was discussed. It is anticipated that hedge cutting along Church Lane will be required with £100.00 earmarked. In the light of this and the proposed increase in charitable donations, and since it had been noted that the Precept had not changed since 2004, it was proposed and agreed to raise the precept in 2016/17 from £250.00 to £300.00.

# (g) Other financial matters:

The Parish Meeting has received notification from SALC in respect of funding from the UK Government Transparency Fund for Smaller Authorities to assist Parish Councils to comply with the Transparency Code for Smaller Authorities. Having reviewed the scope of the funding and the needs of TPPM it was decided that an application for funding was not needed.

Notification was received on the 4<sup>th</sup> November 2015 of funding available through Councillor Kearsley's £5,000 locality budget. Suggestions were invited to be put forward for funding through this route. It was proposed that support be provided to Thornham Parva Parochial Church Council should it decide to bid for funding to pay for the supply and erection of tourist destination signs from the A140 to the church.

Those present at the meeting sent their warm congratulations to Alan.

Christine Moore offered to plant a suitable tree to commemorate the occasion of her Mother's 100<sup>th</sup> birthday at the end of June. This was accepted and it was agreed this would be sited on the grassed area near the church.

Rural Community Transport Re-Tender — Most current community transport providers' contracts end in 2016 and the County is currently re-tendering for this service. The County Council cabinet agreed to a new model for the coordination and funding of rural transport which aims to provide an improved and more consistent service across Suffolk. Providers operating County Council owned vehicles will be affected as the Council will not retain vehicles under the new strategy. Changes can be expected to current services in mid-2016. Details of the tender are available on suffolkonboardcontracts

**Devolution** – Representatives of 7 local authorities in Norfolk and Suffolk and the LEP Chairman met with central government on 4<sup>th</sup> November. The principles of agreement are still under discussion, further detail is expected to be made public in early 2016.

**Highways** – The possibility of extending the 30 mph speed limit on Gislingham Road to Thornham Walks may be reviewed by area highway officer Josh Kerridge to see if this objective has any chance of becoming a reality.
